




Research Funds Awarded to U of T by Sector (2021–2022)

Total Funding \$495 million






Tri-Agency Funding to U15 Universities Including Partner Hospitals (2021–2022)

Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) Funding to U15 Universities (2016–2017 to 2021–2022)







U of T is dedicated to creating a supportive environment for Indigenous research.


