Development of students' writing, research and time management skills


- Teaching students how to conduct and organize research



Academic Integrity Education Initiatives: Divisional Level

 Academic Integrity Education is grounded in and begins in the classroom

Faculty of Arts & Science:

- Classroom Workshops
- 7 College Writing Centres and 2 Departmental Writing Clinics

Academic Discipline Statistics 2022-23

Offence numbers peaked in 2020-21, the first academic year of entirely online learning due to the pandemic

In 2021-22, numbers generally started to fall from their peak

<u>Last year</u>: further post-pandemic reduction in offence numbers in most large divisions

Note:

Some divisions had no increase in offence numbers during the pandemic



Generative AI (ChatGPT)



Every instructor will have different guidance on use of Generative AI in their classroom



Generally speaking, use of Generative AI tools not permitted on assignments unless instructor advises otherwise



Support for instructors on redesigning assessments



Student communication materials advise caution and encourage students to ask instructors for their classroom rules

Large number of offences during pandemic led to an increased volume of cases heading to the University Tribunal.

Timelines are being closely monitored.
