

Voting Instructions for the 2018 By-Election UTM Campus Council Administrative Staff

For the purposes of the UTM Campus Council by-election, Administrative Staff means the employees of the University, University College, the Constituent Colleges, and the Federated Universities who are not members of the Teaching Staff; and who hold their major appointment at the University of Toronto Mississauga.

Please read the instructions and the candidates' statements provided below before voting.

1. All administrative staff who have an email account within the utoronto.ca domain registered in the Human Resources Information System (HRIS) must vote on-line at the website listed below.

- 2. Voting commences at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 and concludes on Tuesday, October 16, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.
- 3. You may vote for one (1) of the three (3) candidates.
- 4. To access the on-line ballot, you must enter your personnel number and date of birth¹.
- 5. Verification of your eligibility to vote in the administrative staff election will be determined by records provided by the HRIS.
- 6. Once you have accessed the ballot, you MUST cast your vote. If you log-on and then exit the ballot without voting, you will not be able to re-access the ballot.
- 7. If you do not select a candidate, a warning message will inform you that a selection has not been made. If you choose to cast a blank vote, the ballot will be accepted as submitted.
- 8. After your vote is registered, you cannot access the ballot a second time.

¹ Please note that your personnel number and your vote are stored separately in order to protect confidentiality.
